Contract for Administrative Services – Brooklynn Griffith: Councilor Sperry moved to approve the administrative services contract between the City of Fossil and Brooklynn Griffith; Councilor Burlingame seconded the motion. Motion passed by unanimous vote.

Property Abatement: Council would like to see the abatement process move forward. Deputy Hines went over the abatement procedures; property owner has been served his final warning/citation. The next step is for the property owner to report to court. Deputy Hines is working on an additional abatement property as well.
