Motion passed by unanimous vote (aye: Councilor Sperry, Councilor Beckham, Mayor MacInnes, no: none).

Resolution No. 449 A Resolution Acknowledging Unanticipated Revenue: Mayor MacInnes read Resolution No. 449. Councilor Sperry made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 449, Councilor Beckham seconded the motion. Motion passed by unanimous vote (aye: Councilor Sperry, Councilor Beckham, Mayor MacInnes, no: none).

Resolution No. 450 A Resolution Transferring Funds from the Industrial Park: Tabled.

Resolution No. 451 A Resolution Transferring Funds from the Ambulance Fund: Mayor MacInnes read Resolution No. 451. Councilor Sperry made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 451, Councilor Beckham seconded the motion. Motion passed by unanimous vote (aye: Councilor Sperry, Councilor Beckham, Mayor MacInnes, no: none).

Remove Mayor Carol MacInnes, Council President Melanie Sperry, and Councilor Jerry Beckham from all bank signature cards: Councilor Sperry made a motion to remove Carol MacInnes, Melanie Sperry, Jerry Beckham, and Brooklynn Griffith from the Bank of Eastern Oregon Signature Cards, effective January 10th, 2023, and add Lea Moyer, Terri Hunt, Chad Macomber, and Tim Milligan to the Bank of Eastern Oregon Signature Cards, effective January 10th, 2023. This way there will be no gap in financial matters before the transition of office. Councilor Sperry made the motion in favor; Councilor Beckham seconded the motion. Motion passed by unanimous vote. (Aye: Councilor Sperry, Councilor Beckham, Mayor MacInnes, no: none). Mayor MacInnes will be need to be removed from any online access documents and may be changed to the new mayor.

Purchase Request (Lift Station alarm system): Bill Potter presented a SMART Level Remote Sewer Monitoring System quote of being ½ the price of TAG's quote. This quote is \$8000 per site install with discounted rates for additional installs. Councilor Sperry made a motion to accept the SMART Level Remote Sewer Monitoring System, Councilor Beckham seconded the motion. Purchase Request (Leaf Blower): Councilor Sperry made a motion to purchase the professional backpack leaf blower, Councilor Beckham seconded the motion. Motion passed by a unanimous vote (aye: Councilor Sperry, Councilor Beckham, Mayor MacInnes, no: none).

Councilor Sperry made a motion to purchase a welder, Councilor Beckham seconded the motion. Motion passed by unanimous vote (aye: Councilor Sperry, Councilor Beckham, Mayor MacInnes, no: none).

Wheeler County Rattler's Day Proclamation: Mayor MacInnes declared December 20th as Wheeler County Rattler Day in the City of Fossil.
